





Spruce Run Apartments North Royalton Ohio

Overnight Fire Rips Through Apartment Complex

NORTH ROYALTON, Ohio — Residents of a North Royalton apartment complex experienced a rude awakening early Wednesday morning as fire quickly spread through their building, Fox 8's Stacey Frey reports.

The blaze broke out just before 3 a.m. inside the Spruce Run Apartments at 13293 Spruce Run Drive in North Royalton. That's located in between State Route 82 and the Ohio Turnpike.

Crews from the North Royalton Fire Department, Parma Fire Department and Strongsville Fire Department responded to the scene. As of 6:30 a.m., firefighters were still there putting out hot spots.

A spokesperson for the North Royalton Police Department tells Fox 8 News that all apartment occupants made it out of the building safely. Frey reports that a ladder was used to rescue one couple.

The city's fire chief says that his department's investigation is just beginning, but it looks as if the blaze started on the second floor before spreading onto the third floor and into the attic. Flames could be seen shooting out the roof of the big complex.

The chief adds that there was initial concern regarding spillover into nearby apartments, but crews were fortunately able to contain the fire to one-half of the one building.

A cause is not yet known.



BUT, THINGS have changed. In 1974, nine victories. Last year, seven more. This year, Columbia's first championship?

It's possible. For the third straight year, the Raiders are legitimate Inland Conference title contenders. And if Columbia DOES win its first league crown, it'll be coach Rick Kunkle's first one, too.

This is Kunkle's initial high school head coaching test.

"I'm new to coaching in this area, but our coaches seem to think that Buckeye and Firelands will be the teams we'll have to beat," Kunkle said during yesteday's morning workouts.

"We have 12 good seniors, excellent leadership and fine strength in the offensive backfield," he said. "But the higgest question is how quickly the kids will adjust to a new system."

Last year, Columbia ran the Power-I offense and used a 6-2 defense.

Under the new head coach Kunkle, the Raiders will shift with a two tight end attack, while going with a 5-3 defense. "WE LACK depth and speed, but we have size," Kunkle said. "Our best size is in the backfield though, not on the line."

Heading the Raiders attack are quarterback Scott Shirley, and backs Roger Yost and Craig Ross — all seasoned starters

"Yost could be tough to stop if he gets going," Rick noted. "The best thing about this team is their good attitude and excellent discipline."

Kunkle is getting a slow start because he was hired just two weeks ago. However, he quickly noted a few tough performers who'll snatch starting roles.

THE COACH likes tackle Joe Smith, center Bob Serina and guard Scott Pick Smith, who may play both ways, will be joined on defense by middle linebacker Cliff Allen.

Fifteen lettermen return, but much of the 39-man squad consists of underclassmen. But with a low number of key injuries, Columbia should continue its current two-year trend of playing winning football.

Kunkle is assisted by Tom Fragasse, Jim Waldecker, Chuck Rimer and Ed Bak.

"Never give up; never surrender!"

Lynn Babin LIVING WITH NECK & BACK PAIN

n nursing school, Lynn Babin was taught that "pain is what the patient says it is, not what you think," and the spunky mother of three believes every medical professional should adopt the same attitude. After enduring several injuries that left her with chronic and often severe pain, Babin found she was forced to become her own pain management advocate.

"In 1997, I fell while running and subsequently had major reconstructive knee surgery," Babin explains. "Two weeks later, I fell headfirst down a full flight of stairs while wearing my leg brace, suffering multiple fractures, lacerations and hematomas, but most significantly, neck and back injuries. The following month, while stopped at a red light, I was rear-ended and suffered shoulder, head and neck injuries. Ten years, three

knee surgeries, a left shoulder and rotator cuff surgery, two foot surgeries and several abdominal surgeries later, I deal with chronic pain in my ankles, knees, hip, back, shoulder and neck. I wear braces on both legs."

Babin's injuries forced her to leave her position as an Intensive Care Unit nurse, and currently, she travels three to five days a week for her job as a regional clinical research associate. Babin wears braces that can be removed easily at security checkpoints and keeps a travel pillow with her for neck support. She receives a onehour massage every week to help with spasms and has regular appointments with a chiropractor, orthopedic surgeons and several specialists and physical therapists. When her muscles cramp, Babin uses

heat to help with the discomfort and turns to ice packs when her ioints swell.

"I have averaged at least one surgery a year since my accident," Babin says. "My coping first revolved around my children, I think that in and of itself provides such strength and courage. I have always been a fighter and I guess in my heart of hearts I would never give in and become an invalid no matter what it took.

"For over a decade now, I have been fighting doctors and family members who just do not understand how chronic pain affects one's life and who seem to be of the opinion that we should just 'snap out of it,' and get on with our lives," Babin says. "After a while, you begin to believe it and start giving up. I, like many others suffering



from chronic pain, considered suicide on several occasions. No one knows how hard it is to get out of bed every morning. Due to several wonderful individuals in my life, I did not give up and I force myself each and every day to move my painful joints and get out of bed. My best advice comes from one of my favorite movies of all time, *Galaxy Quest*, and is 'Never give up; never surrender!"

The senior defender headed in a corner kick from Mani Brueckner (Valencia, Pa./Mars Area) for the first score. The play resulted in Brueckner's school record 12th assist of the season.

Sidney Morgan (Middleburg Heights, Ohio/Midpark) extended the lead to 2-0 with her first career goal three minutes and one second later. The true freshman took a pass from Michelle Genetin (Navarre, Ohio/Perry) and scored into the bottom left side of the net.

It was up to the Gannon defense after that. The Lady Knights were forced to maintain the lead shorthanded after a red card was handed out with 5:42 left in the first half. The squad managed to get to halftime with a 2-0 advantage, before having to fight off the final 45 minutes down a player.

ERIE, Pa. – East Stroudsburg out-scored Gannon 5-4 in penalty kicks following a scoreless Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) quarterfinal match Thursday afternoon at Gannon University Field and eliminated the third-seeded Lady Knights, advancing to the PSAC Women's Soccer Final Four hosted by California (Pa.) this weekend.

Gannon controlled the majority of the match according to the shots chart. The Lady Knights held a 6-2 edge during the first half, a 16-5 advantage during the second half and took all five shots during the two overtime sessions. The final total was 27-7 in favor of the Lady Knights.

However, Gannon managed to get only 10 of those 27 shots on goal. East Stroudsburg goalkeeper Brittain Wagner turned away all 10 of those shots.

Gannon best's scoring chance arguably came during the 19th minute when the Lady Knights were able to create a one-on-one with Wagner, but the shot rung off the right post.

Sidney Morgan 2012 PSAC Quarter Finals Gannon V vs Stroudsburg V Nov 1 2012 Head coach Colin Petersen's club had two solid chances during the waning minutes of regulation. Maddi Buckham (Copley, Ohio/Copley) ripped a quality shot that appeared to be heading top shelf in the 83rd minute, but Wagner barely tipped the ball over the bar. Moments later in the 86th minute, Gannon controlled a loose ball that Wagner was unable to pull in. But with Wagner out of the goal and only an East Stroudsburg defender left in front of the net, the ensuing shot sailed wide.

Statistically, the match ended in a tie following two more scoreless periods in overtime. The deadlock forced a penalty kick shoot-out to determine which team would advance to the conference final four.

East Stroudsburg earned the honor after converting all five of its penalty kicks. Mani Brueckner (Valencia, Pa./Mars Area), Justine Rodrigues (Georgetown, Ontario/Georgetown District), Kaitlyn Kissell (Erie, Pa./Villa Maria Academy) and Sidney Morgan (Middleburg Heights, Ohio/Midpark) all scored for Gannon. The deciding play was Wagner's diving save on the Lady Knights' fourth attempt.

Gannon, ranked eighth in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) national rankings and third in the NCAA Division II Atlantic regional rankings, moved to 13-3-2 overall with the postseason tie. The verdict snapped a four-match win streak. East Stroudsburg, tabbed sixth in the latest regional rankings, is now 10-4-5 overall after posting its second victory of the season against the Lady Knights.

Head coach Colin Petersen's club now awaits word on a possible NCAA Division II Tournament bid. The NCAA Selection Show is scheduled for Monday, November 5 at 7:30 p.m. on http://www.ncaa.com.



GANNON - Junior goalkeeper <u>Brittain Wagner</u> made 10 saves in the first 110 minutes, then turned away a penalty kick in the shootout as East Stroudsburg University advanced to the PSAC women's soccer semifinals for the first time since 2008 with a 5-4 PK shootout victory at Gannon on Thursday afternoon.

After a scoreless regulation, the Warriors buried all five of their penalty kicks, and Wagner made the save on Gannon's fourth PK. Sophomore back Kelly Clark gave ESU a 4-3 lead after Wagner's save, and redshirt junior back Carly Collins buried the game-winner to end the contest.

ESU (10-4-5), the tournament's No. 6 seed, takes on No. 7 Slippery Rock (11-5-2) on Saturday at 1:30 p.m. at top seed California. Slippery Rock knocked off No. 2 West Chester, 2-1; California advanced with a 1-0 win over IUP; and No. 4 Edinboro beat Kutztown, 2-1, to set the Final Four.

Gannon (13-3-2) had most of the chances in regulation and overtime, holding a 27-7 advantage in shots, but Wagner had a number of key saves. The biggest came with just under 10 minutes left in regulation when she deflected a point-blank shot by Maddi Buckham over the crossbar.

In the penalty kick shootout, Gannon (shooting first) and ESU both converted their first three before Wagner's save. Senior midfielders Marissa Spitler, Cree Julian and Ashley McKenna took the first three for the Warriors, followed by Clark and Collins.

ESU and Slippery Rock tied, 1-1, in their first meeting on October 6 at Eiler-Martin Stadium. Freshman forward Madeline DeVico scored the game-tying goal for ESU in the 59th minute after Slippery Rock's Shelby Ward scored in the 16th. Wagner had seven saves, SRU's Dana O'Neill had four saves and the Rock had a 16-13 edge in shots.

Achievement Has Its Own Reward

Tomorrow will be a very big day for some 30 youngsters who live in Greater Cleveland. They will appear on a musical program at the Cleveland Public Library at 7:30 p.m. to which the public is invited.

The boys and girls will take part in a dance and musical program, dressed in colorful costumes made by their parents under the guidance of their teacher in dance, Miss Dusti O'Connor, and they will wear make up.

None of this sounds unusual, and it isn't—for normal children. But these youngsters are retarded. They have to make a great effort to do things that come easily to other children.

The program will mark the very first time that such a concert has been given in the Cleveland Public Library.

ACCORDING to Mrs. Manuel Shapiro, a leader in the work of educating brain-damaged children, this concert is the culmination of many years of musical training offered individually to children in county classes for the retarded or by volunteers who are professional musicians.

One of their teachers says the children are eagerly looking forward to the program for "This is the most important thing that has ever happened to them."

The program is sponsored by the library's Judd Fund Division under the supervision of Miss Clara Lucioli, who directs the Hospitals and Institutions Department, and by the Cleveland Music School Settlement.

DUSTI O'CONNOR is one of the volunteers who has contributed importantly to training the youngsters (who want so

much to be like other people).

Miss O'Connor, who has a dance studio in Parma, spends her free Friday morning teaching classes for the retarded children at Harper School, 5513 Ira Avenue S.W. She has been doing this for six years.

Other volunteers include:

Klaus Fiedler, German exchange teacher at the Cleveland Music School Settlement, who does volunteer work at Murray Hill School.

Miss Magda-Lynn Kachmar, a fuli-time voice teacher at the Cleveland Institute of Music, who still manages to find time to sing with the retarded children.

Miss Kate Hooper, a former Peace Corps worker, who works with the youngsters on their singing.

Mrs. Denver Smith, who lives in Bedford but travels to volunteer classes in Harvard and Warner Schools on the southeast side.

Mrs. Clarence Witmer, who spends two mornings a week at Brett School teaching older children. Mrs. Edward Eichner, music teacher, who works with slightly older children at Murray Hill classes and at the Circle Workshop.

Mrs. Gloria Medoff, wife of Dr. Hert Medoff, who volunteers her services at the singing class at Southgate Pre-Workshop.

And Mrs. George Rosin, professional singer who loves singing with the retarded children. She has also assisted with the program for six years.

Tomorrow is a big day for the volunteers, too.
